BUT SERIOUSLY FOR A MOMENT

A number of times during the past year I have been asked about model flying affecting full size flying in light of proposals to legislate model flying. It was getting to such a political stage that I decided to consult the books and search out the present rules regarding our hobby. The following are taken from the Air Navigation Order 1984.

AND ART 795 AND DO TO THE MYSTER ARE THE SEA OF A PROPERTY OF THE SEA OF

The provisions of this order, other than ART46 and ART47 hereof, shall not apply to or in relation to:

- (a) Any balloon which at any stage of its flight is not more than 2 metres in any linear dimension including any basket or other equipment attached to the balloon./
 - (b) Any kite weighing not more than 2kg.
- (c) Any other aircraft weighing not more than 5kg without fuel.

ANO ART 46 A person shall not recklessly or negligently cause or permit an aircraft to endanger any person or property.

AND ART 67 - Within U.K.

- (a) A captive balloom or kite shall not be flown at a height of more than 60 metres above ground level, or within 60 metres of any yessel, vehicle or structure.
- (b) A captive balloon shall not be flown within 5km of an
- aerodrome.
 (c) A ballom exceeding 2 metres in any linear dimension at any stage of it's flight including any basket or other equipment attatched to the balloon, shall not be flown in controlled airspace.
- (d) A kite shall not be flown within 5km of an aerodrome.

(e) An airship shall not be moored, without the permission in writing of the Authority and in accordance with any conditions subject to which that permission may be granted.

Heavy going isn't it, but that is the law as it stands. Please read it carefully. It is noticable that ART 95(c) and ART 46 have been broken in the past, and also that they are the ONLY rules that apply. What may apply in the future is only speculation at the moment. We will deal with any future rules when or if they ever appear. Know the rules and fly safely and sensibly.
